Today's Game: This week's MEAC Game of the Week features the two winningest programs in the conference over the past three years in the 11th ranked Pirates of Hampton and the Bulldogs of South Carolina State. At 7-0 overall and 5-0 in league play, the Pirates are currently sitting along atop the MEAC standings and in control of their own destiny as they attempt to become the first team in more than 20 years to win three straight championships. Hampton enters the matchup having won 24 consecutive regular season games and 17 straight MEAC contests following their 42-13 victory over Norfolk State last Saturday.

After a 1-3 start to this season, the Bulldogs have put together two consecutive conference wins to keep themselves very much in the hunt for the MEAC championship. A win over the Pirates and South Carolina State would put itself in at least a tie for first place with four conference games remaining.

Series History: This will be the 13th meeting between the Pirates and the Bulldogs with Hampton holding a decisive 11-1 advantage including winning the last three contests. SCSU's only victory came back in 2002 when the Bulldogs defeated Hampton 47-41 in an overtime thriller in Orangeburg. The Pirates are 4-1 in games at Oliver C. Dawson Bulldog Stadium. In their last visit back in 2004, Princeton Shepherd connected with Jerome Mathis for a 98-yard touchdown pass to mark the longest completion in Hampton history.

The Coaches: Joe Taylor is entering his 15th season at the helm of the Pirate program and his 24th season overall as a head coach. He is Hampton's all-time winningest coach with a record of 127-42-1, guiding the Pirates to seven conference championships (4 MEAC, 3 CIAA), four SBN Black College National Championships and six playoff appearances. With 188 career victories, head coach Joe Taylor ranks fourth on the list of winningest active coaches in Division I-AA. His .713 winning percentage is fifth among active coaches as well.

A 1975 graduate of South Carolina State, Buddy Pough is in his fifth year at his alma mater and

has compiled an overall record of 36-16, 25-9 against MEAC foes. Pough has quickly turned the Bulldogs into one of the premier programs in the MEAC, losing just three conference games over the last three seasons and winning a share of the league championship in 2004.

The Last Time They Met: Rudolph Foye sacked South Carolina State quarterback Cleveland McCoy on 4th-and-2 at the Hampton 26-yard line late in the fourth quarter to preserve a 14-10 lead and help the No. 4 Pirates down the 19th ranked Bulldogs on homecoming at Armstrong Stadium.

The Bulldogs took an early 10-0 first quarter lead on an 8-yard run by Jonathan Woods and a 29-yard field goal by Stephen Grantham. With 4:16 to go before halftime the Pirates inserted backup quarterback Antwan Smith to spark the HU offense. On his first play from scrimmage he hit Marquay McDaniel in the seam for a 52-yard touchdown. Hampton got the ball back with 2:27 on the clock and Smith again found McDaniel for a 9-yard score to put the Pirates in front for good.

SCSU ran for 269 yards on the day to Hampton's 134, holding possession of the ball for nearly 36 minutes.

The Last Time Out: Princeton Shepherd was named Offensive MVP of the Battle of the Bay after accounting for 259 yards of total offense and four touchdowns against Norfolk State as the Pirates cruised to a 42-13 victory. He completed 12-of-19 passes for 209 yards and a career-high four touchdowns passes of 32, 31, 26 and 43 yards. He also rushed for a season-high 50 yards. His performance marked his third three touchdown performance of the season and the second straight game with at least 3 TDs.

Palmetto Pirates: Hampton currently has six players on the active roster that hail from the state of South Carolina, including three starters in QB Princeton Shepherd, RG Akeem Lamar and LB Justin Durant.

In The Polls: The Pirates jumped up one spot to No. 11 in the Sports Network I-AA Poll, but fell from 10th to 11th in the College Sporting News Coaches Poll. Hampton did remain No. 1 in the Sheridan Broadcasting Network's Black College Football Poll, receiving 28 of the possible 30 first place votes.

HU Versus The MEAC: Since the 2003 season the Pirates have a conference record of 24-3, including 17 consecutive victories, with all three losses coming on the road. Hampton's last MEAC loss came with a 28-23 defeat at Delaware State back on Oct. 2, 2004.

Quick Strike Potential: Under new offensive coordinator Chris Beatty the Hampton offense has shown that it is capable of scoring quickly and from anywhere on the field. The Pirates have had 39 scoring drives on the year and 29 (74%) of them have taken less than four minutes off the clock. In fact, 14 have taken less than two minutes and three times the Pirates scored on the first play of the drive.

Explosive Plays: Led by Marquay McDaniel's nine, the Pirates have had 27 plays this season that went for 20 or more yards, 18 coming through the air and nine on the ground. Onrea Jones and Kevin Beverly rank second and third on the team in 20-yard plays with five and four respectively.

HU Block Party: After blocking three kicks in the season opener against Grambling State and another versus Morgan State, the Pirates' special teams came through again with two more in the Circle City Classic against Central State. In fact, since the 2003 season the Pirates have blocked a total of 26 field goals, extra points and punts. After blocking nine kicks in 2003, the Pirates registered six and five in the following two seasons and this year they already have six in seven games. Calvin Bannister leads Hampton with six blocks during this span and Kendall Langford ranks second with four.

Now That's Efficient: The Pirates have managed to put up points in 27 of the 28 quarters played thus far, while holding their opposition scoreless in 17 quarters. They're streak of 16 consecutive quarters with a point scored ended in the first quarter at Delaware State, but the Pirates rebounded to post points in the final three periods. As was the case a year ago, Hampton has done most of its damage in the second and fourth quarters, outscoring opponents 132-54 during those periods.

253 And Counting: With 253 consecutive games without being shutout, Hampton currently leads I-AA in that category. The last time the Pirates were held scoreless was back on Sept. 1, 1984 when they fell to Tennessee State 44-0 in the season opener.

Points Off Turnovers: The Pirates have made a habit of scoring points off turnovers thus far in the 2006 season. Hampton has converted 19 turnovers (including TO on downs) into 91 points, all coming on Pirate touchdowns. The HU offense has been able to produce points at a 68% (13-of-19) clip after gaining possession from an opponent turnover.

Kick Return Game Tops In I-AA: The Pirates' kickoff and punt returners have routinely been among the best in the country over the past several years, and this season appears to be no different. As a team Hampton is fifth in kickoff returns, while sophomore Kevin Teel currently leads the nation in with an average of 34.83 yards, including a 92-yard touchdown to open the second half at Delaware State.

HU Leading MEAC In Several Categories: In addition to leading the league in several team statistical categories, Princeton Shepherd is tops in TD passes (15), Marquay McDaniel in touchdown receptions (11), total touchdowns (12) and scoring (72 pts.) and Justin Durant in tackles (55).

season, the Pirate defense is ranked third in the country in tackles for loss with 60 for an average of 8.57 per game. Leading the way is the duo of Justin Durant (9 TFL) and Kendall Langford (8.5 TFL).

Coleman 92 Yards Shy Of MEAC Record: Alonzo Coleman ran for 172 yards and three touchdowns in the Pirates' 46-7 win over Howard to establish three new marks in the Hampton University record books. With 4,051 rushing yards, 57 touchdowns and 342 points, Coleman is now the Pirates' all-time leader in all three categories, surpassing former HU standout Montrell Coley (1997-00). In addition, his 342 points also topped Coley for the MEAC's all-time scoring mark. Coleman needs just 92 more yards to surpass Howard's Harvey Reed (4,142 yds) and become the MEAC's all-time leading rusher.

Countdown to 1,000: With 455 rushing yards this season, Alonzo Coleman is just 545 yards shy of becoming just the third player in Division I-AA history to have four consecutive 1,000-yard seasons, joining Jerry Azumah (New Hampshire, 95-98) and Adrian Peterson (Georgia Southern, 98-01). Harvard's Clifton Dawson and UMASS' Steve Baylark are also looking to accomplish this feat.

Beverly's Sets New Mark Against Aggies: Kevin Beverly's 204 yards rushing and four touchdowns against North Carolina A&T both established a new marks at Hampton for a player making his first career start. In addition, his four touchdown performance is also tied for the MEAC lead in points in a single game this season with 24.

Shepherd Thriving Under New Offense: Despite having to adjust to a new offensive scheme, quarterback Princeton Shepherd has shown that he is indeed capable of being a drop back passer and keeping opposing defenses from keying on running back Alonzo Coleman. Through the first seven games of the season Shepherd has completed 90-of-131 passes for 1,132 yards and 15 touchdowns, already surpassing his touchdown total from 2005. He is tied for second in the country with 15 TD passes, ranks second in passing efficiency (177.5) and his 68.7 completion percentage ranks seventh. Against Norfolk State Shepherd threw for 209 yards and a career-high four touchdowns to improve to 28-5 as a starter.

Shepherd Third All-Time In Yards, Completions, TD's: Senior Princeton Shepherd is back for his third season as the starting quarterback and he's looking to join Matt Montgomery (1991-94) as the only Hampton signal caller to guide the Pirates to three consecutive conference titles. Shepherd has a remarkable record of 28-5 as a starter, with four of those losses coming by a combined 25 points, and he has tossed at least one touchdown pass in 26 of those 33 games. With 4,498 yards passing for his career, Shepherd now sits in third place on the Pirates' all-time list. Shepherd is also second in total offense (4,873), third in pass completions (306) and third in touchdown passes (46).

Hitting His Mark: With his 68.7 completion percentage, Princeton Shepherd is on pace to break the Hampton single-season mark currently held by Roy Johnson who connected on 59.9% (148-of-247) of his attempts in 1999. Shepherd, whose previous season-high completion percentage was 56.7, has connected on over 70% of his throws in four of the seven games this season. In the remaining three contests he was still over 60%. In addition, his conference-leading 15 touchdown passes average out to one per six pass completions, or one per 8.7 pass attempts.

3 For 2: For the second time in as many weeks No. 2 Marquay McDaniel hauled in three touchdowns receptions from quarterback Princeton Shepherd to help lead the Pirates to victory. McDaniel is now tied with Bruce Hocker of Duquesne for the national lead with 11 touchdown receptions. His 115-yard, three touchdown effort against Norfolk State was the fifth time in his career that he's had multiple touchdowns and his fourth 100-yard receiving game.

McDaniel Making History Of His Own: While running back Alonzo Coleman has garnered much of the attention for his record setting efforts, Marquay McDaniel has quietly become I-

AA's all-time leader in punt returns. McDaniel entered the season ranked No. 1 in career punt return yards and he continues to add to his total which now stands at 1,843. In addition, with 136 career returns he is just eight shy of overtaking former Montana return man Levander Segars (143) for the all-time lead in that category as well.

Making His Mark: In his final campaign with the Pirates, Marquay McDaniel is making sure that his name will remain in the Hampton record books for some time. With 36 receptions for 488 yards and 11 touchdowns, he has moved into the top six in three career receiving categories. McDaniel ranks fourth in career receptions (128), tied for fifth in receiving touchdowns (19) and sixth in receiving yards (1,728).

Keeping Up With Jones: With his four receptions for 59 yards and a touchdown last week versus Norfolk State, senior wide receiver Onrea Jones extended his streak of games having at least one reception to 18. The last time Jones went without a reception was against Jackson State in the 2005 season opener.

Durant Listed As Top 5 LB By Mel Kiper: The two-time MEAC Defensive Player of the Year Justin Durant has caught the eye of NFL draft guru Mel Kiper. Prior to the season Kiper rated his top five seniors at each position and Durant is ranked No. 4 at inside linebacker and he also has the distinction of being the only Division I-AA player among the 80 seniors listed.

Durant Climbs To Third All-Time In Total Tackles: With 310 total tackles for his career (156 solo), linebacker Justin Durant has moved up to third place all-time at Hampton behind only Gareth Bonds (389) and James Chapman (332). His 156 solo stops rank fourth.

Bain & Bannister Anchoring HU Secondary: Senior cornerback Travarous Bain has displayed the skills and abilities that have led to him being ranked among the top cover guys in the country. He is tied with several players for third in I-AA with four interceptions and nine passes defensed. Playing opposite Bain is fellow senior Calvin Bannister who has been a mainstay for the Pirates for the past four years. Bannister has come up with interceptions in each of the last two games, returning one 61 yards for a touchdown against Central State. However, those around Hampton know that he's been producing since his arrival as freshman when registered 16 passes defensed.

Making The Most Of It: Linebackers Henti Baird and Demarius Sapp are making the most of their increased playing time this season. Baird played safety a year ago and finished the year with 10 total tackles, but through seven games he already has amassed 20 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss, half a sack and a blocked punt versus Central State. Sapp has made numerous big hits on defense and on special teams and having the best season of his career by far, ranking third on the team with 32 tackles (15 solo), four tackles for loss, a sack and a fumble recovery.

Bryant Coming On Strong: Nose guard Vernon Bryant began to come into his own towards the end of the 2005 season and he's picked right up where he left off. Bryant, who totaled 29 tackles and 4.5 sacks in his first two seasons, led the Pirates with three sacks through the first six ball games. He has also added 16 tackles and recovered two fumbles.

HU Defense Continues Streak: With two interceptions last week, the Pirates extended their streak of consecutive games having forced a turnover. Hampton has forced its opponents

into at least one turnover in each of the last 33 games. The last time the HU defense went without forcing a turnover was back on Nov. 8, 2003 at Bethune-Cookman.

Coleman and Durant Up For National Awards: Hampton linebacker Justin Durant has been tabbed by The Sports Network as one of the leading 16 candidates for the Buck Buchanan Award, given annually to the top defensive player in Division I-AA, while his teammate Alonzo Coleman is among the leading candidates for the Payton Award which goes to the best player on the offensive side of the ball.

Coleman and Daniels Made History In 2005: The running back tandem of Alonzo Coleman and Ardell Daniels ran for 1,326 and 1,044 yards respectively in 2005 to become just the third pair of backs to each rush for 1,000 yards in consecutive seasons, after the duo also did it in 2004. After splitting time and carries for the past three years, Coleman is finally the focal point of the Pirates' ground game which should allow for him to add to his school record 21 100-yard games.

Pirate Trio Tops Among Active I-AA Players: Alonzo Coleman's 57 total touchdowns and 55 rushing touchdowns rank first among active players in Division I-AA, while his 342 points rank second and his 4,051 rushing yards rank third. Fellow Pirate senior Marquay McDaniel also leads all active players with 136 punt returns and 1,843 punt return yards. His 13.55 yard return average ranks fourth. With his 51 made field goals Andrew Paterini is second in that category, while his 319 points rank fourth.

HU Dominates Preseason All-MEAC Honors: When the preseason all-conference team was announced the Pirates not only landed a league-high nine players on it, but they also swept Player of the Year honors. Senior running back Alonzo Coleman was named the Preseason Offensive Player of the Year for the third consecutive season to lead five Pirates on the offensive side of the ball. The 2004 and 2005 MEAC Defensive Player of the Year, senior linebacker Justin Durant was again tabbed to walk away with the league's top defensive honor in 2006.

Pirates Picked To Repeat: The reigning Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) champion Hampton University was picked to capture its third consecutive conference title according to the media and coaches polls released at the MEAC Football Press Luncheon in Virginia Beach. In addition, the Pirates swept the Preseason Player of the Year honors and landed nine players on the Preseason All-MEAC Football Team.

The Pirates received 10 of 16 possible first place votes in the media poll and six of nine votes in the coaches' poll. South Carolina State was predicted to finish second in both polls, while Bethune-Cookman and Florida A&M were predicted to place third in the media and coaches polls respectively.

Sports Network Positional Rankings: HU linebacker Justin Durant was ranked as the second best linebacker in the country according to a preseason poll distributed by The Sports Network. Defensive end Kendall Langford and cornerback Travarous Bain were ranked third and seventh at their positions respectively. On the offensive side of the ball Alonzo Coleman was tabbed as the seventh best running back and placekicker Andrew Paterini ranked fourth.

Old Faces In New Places: Several veterans are back but in different positions this season on both sides of the ball. Offensively, Antwan Smith who came into camp as the No. 2 quarterback has been moved to defensive back. West Virginia transfer TJ Mitchell will now backup Princeton Shepherd. On defense, former defensive backs Henti Baird and Ray Lewis have moved down to linebacker. Both bring big hit abilities and Baird adds great athleticism which he displayed during preseason testing with a school record 41 inch vertical jump. Akeem Lamar has also made the switch from offensive line to defensive tackle where he should see plenty of action.

2006 Leadership Committee: Getting away from the normal practice of selecting team captains, the Pirates have instead implemented a Leadership Committee for the third straight season. The committee of 10 is charged with acting as spokesmen for the team and handling situations related to team policies, academic affairs and other topics.
